**NORFOLK ISLAND PUBLIC HALL**  
**ORDINANCE 1951-1953.\***

An Ordinance to vest in Trust certain lands in Norfolk Island as a site for a public hall and for other purposes.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Norfolk Island Public Hall Ordinance 1951-1953.\**

2. The *Rawson Hall Ordinance 1929* is repealed.

Repeal.

3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears:—

Definition.

“the Trust” means the Trust constituted by section four of this Ordinance.

4.—(1.) For the purposes of this Ordinance, there shall be a Trust which shall consist of seven trustees, residents of Norfolk Island, who shall be nominated by the Administrator and appointed by the ~~Minister~~ ~~Administrator~~ ~~Executive member~~

(2.) The trustees shall hold office for a period of two years and shall be eligible for re-appointment.

(3.) Where the office of a trustee becomes vacant before the expiration of the period of his appointment, the ~~Minister~~ may appoint a person to the vacant office for the balance of that period.

(4.) The Trust shall be a body corporate by the name of the Norfolk Island Public Hall Trust and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal.

(5.) The powers and capacities of the Trust may be exercised by any five of the trustees.

5.—(1.) The land described in the Schedule to this Ordinance together with all buildings thereon and appurtenances thereto is hereby vested in the Trust for an estate in fee simple upon trust for the use and benefit of the people of Norfolk Island for the purpose of a public hall and for no other purpose whatsoever.

6.—(1.) The Trust shall not without the previous consent in writing of the Minister ~~of the Territory~~ <sup>of the Island</sup>

- (a) assign or sub-let the hall or any portion thereof; or
- (b) alienate the whole or any portion of the land vested in it under this Ordinance.

(2.) The Trust shall maintain the hall in good order and condition.

(3.) The Trust may, from time to time, make such regulations as it deems necessary, subject to the approval of the Administrator, for regulating the use of the hall by the public and fixing the charges to be paid therefor.

#### THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land containing an area of 1 acre 1 rood 21½ perches more or less being Portion No. 24p, Commencing at the southeastern corner of Portion 24i and bounded thence by part of the southeastern boundary of that Portion bearing 34 degrees 15 minutes 630 links thence by lines bearing 124 degrees 15 minutes 240 links and 214 degrees 15 minutes 525 links, thence by part of a northeastern side of Taylor's Road bearing 280 degrees 37 minutes 262 links to the point of commencement.
