FOUNDATION DAY - THANK YOU!

Last week we celebrated the 233rd anniversary of the commencement of the First British Settlement and the landing of Philip Gidley King on 6 March 1788 at what is now Kingston, Norfolk Island. Each year Norfolk Island welcomes many visitors for a week of activities surrounding Foundation Day. Many come to celebrate the lives and learn of the stories of their ancestors, connect with this historic landmark, and immerse themselves in our history. Travel wholesalers and tour operators create specialized itineraries and themed events encouraging visitors to the island every year. The Norfolk Island Museum and Research Centre provide assistance with family research and personalized tours to many of the visiting groups and individuals.

The highlight of Foundation week is of course the re-enactment event on the morning of 6 March. This year, (despite tsunami and cyclone warnings) the day showcased beautiful weather with extremely large crowds gathering to watch the re-enactment of boats bringing to shore the first twenty-three people from the *HMAT Supply* to establish the First British Settlement on Norfolk Island.

Local adults and children acted out the scene and portrayed the lives of these first settlers. Among them were six female convicts, nine male convicts, three seamen, two marines, a surgeon and a surgeon's mate, together with their appointed Commandant, Lieutenant Philip Gidley King. The event began with words of welcome by Eric Hutchinson, the Administrator of Norfolk Island, followed by the re-enactment. Don Christian-Reynolds and Ryan Dixon entertained the crowds with old English songs, and food was provided by various stalls. It was a wonderful commemoration and day of celebration that came together seamlessly through the professional management of Lou Tavener and the team at Go Norfolk Island.
