


DECORATING KINGSTON DRAWING COMPETITION

Late last year the museum was pleased to hold a Kingston drawing competition with Ngaire Sheridan at the Norfolk Island Central School.

A short workshop, focused on Kingston, was held with years 3 - 6 including a pop quiz and identifying the changes in historical images of daun'taun. The many horses roaming Kingston were a common difference picked up by the students as were some of original convict buildings now removed from the landscape. Students were then asked to think about what they loved about daun'taun and to draw their thoughts. We were blown away by the results and had a very hard time picking winners. Thanks to all the students who participated, we were impressed with their solid understanding of the site's history and the quality of artwork produced.







