CONSERVATION ON DISPLAY AT THE A&H SHOW

Norfolk Island Regional Council, Parks Australia, Marine Parks, and the Flora and Fauna Society will be having a joint display at the Norfolk Island Agriculture and Horticultural Show again this year. We will be showcasing rodent control techniques, weeds and control techniques, Norfolk Island Native Vegetation Mapping, native plants, Argentine ants, our critically endangered snails, the Coral Berry Crusaders, and an update on the last 12 months of Norfolk Island Regional Council's Environment Program. Also joining us this year will be a team of scientists from Agriculture Victoria who will present the tools and methods they used to study the DNA of insects, nematodes, bacteria, fungi, and viruses found on Norfolk Island as part of the plant and disease survey they are working on for the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications, and the Arts. The team has invited the community to bring any critters from their gardens for a closer look under a microscope and we also invite you to bring in any unknown weeds for identification. We all look forward to seeing you at the A&H Show on Monday 10th October.
