European honeybees (Apis mellifera) have been a part of Norfolk Island's environment and culture since European settlement. Bees not only provide honey but are also essential in the pollination of many plants and support the production of food on Norfolk Island.

The bee health survey conducted by Dr John Roberts in 2021-22 found Norfolk Island's bees to have fewer pests and pathogens than any other bee population in the world. To keep our bee's healthy one of the key recommendations in the report was for all beekeepers to register their hives and encourage regular hive inspections for any pests or diseases.
