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MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Following the appointment of the Administrator on 5 December 2021, Council staff have been completely focused on responding to the conclusions of the Public Inquiry and completing the adopted External Audit Findings during the term of Administration.

I am pleased to present the 2022/23 Operational Plan providing a Surplus budget position of \$500K.

The Draft Operational Plan presented for public consultation addressed the conclusions of the Public Inquiry, in particular, the revenue opportunities not taken whilst an Elected Council had control.

The Draft Operational Plan presented a significant change in the rating model previously used by Council. This report shifts from a very basic model of 4 rating categories, to a more detailed model utilising sub-categorisation for the first time, introducing 23 rating sub-categories. This model proposes to address the conclusions of the Public Inquiry process in both increasing revenue and improving the equitable distribution of that revenue burden.

Rating sub-categorisation is used extensively across Australia, primarily to address the vast differences we see in access to services by ratepayers, but to more effectively manage revenue collection to meet the needs of the community.

This is a significant shift, and one that will raise questions within our community. I will try to address this change now to begin the discussion.

For the 2022/23 Financial Year, **Council intends to raise \$1.625M from Ordinary Rates**. This is an **increase of \$300K** over the previous year.

Council will use this revenue, together with a \$200K subsidy from the Commonwealth Government, to partly fund the following expenditure for 2022/23:

- Roads maintenance and improvements \$1.4M
- Workshop & Depot \$0.3M
- Parks maintenance and improvements \$0.35M
- Library & Radio Station operation \$0.25M
- Tourism operation & support \$1.0M
- TOTAL \$3.3M

The shortfall of these local service provision areas is met by the Commonwealth Government, **subsidised by \$1.5M**.

The ordinary rate does not cover Administration and Governance costs of Council, which equate to \$5M in this budget, which again is met by the Commonwealth Government in full.

For the 2021/22 Financial Year, Council implemented a Waste Management Charge across all rate notices. Whilst this addressed a significant funding shortage, the operation remained in deficit.

Council has considered the operation further this year, following considerable community consultation on a new Waste Management Strategy and reducing our Domestic and Commercial waste management costs through

tendering to the waste industry market. The 2022/23 Operational Plan now presents a new revenue collection method to fund Council's operational costs for Waste Management.

Given the significant change to the rating model with the introduction of sub-categorisation, this now provides a more effective way to apply differential waste management charges reflecting usage. Council will raise \$1.0M for Waste Management charges for the 2022/23 Financial Year. This is an increase of \$200K from the previous year's charge.

Council will use this revenue, together with a \$800K subsidy from the Commonwealth Government, to partly fund the operation of the Waste Management Centre.

Council will be applying the Waste Management charge directly to the rate notice (same as the 2021/22 Financial Year). Council will no longer operate a ticketing system, with unlimited access to the Waste Management Centre for ratepayers/residents.

These changes will provide the direction to deliver agreed outcomes of the Council in line with the objectives of the Community Strategic Plan (CSP) 2016-2026, the Norfolk Island 9-Point Strategic Action Plan 2020-2024, the External Audit Findings (EAF's), and conclusions of the 2021 Public Inquiry resulting in the requirement to increase land rates by some 25% in 2022-2023. There is also a significant increase in the waste management charge. This is necessary to ensure that Council recovers the full cost of operating the waste management centre and continues to act in an environmentally responsible manner.

The Business/Commercial operations of Council have again met the requirement to operate in surplus, with the exception of Waste Management (\$273K deficit) and Airport operations (\$653K deficit). Both these amounts are attributable to more accurate depreciation figures due to the improvements we have made in the Asset Management systems of Council. The aim is to have these commercial operations in surplus for 2023/24 Financial Year.

There will be a new Service Delivery Agreement with the Commonwealth commencing on 1 July 2022. This has been a result of some hard work between the Council and Department staff over the past 3 months, trying to modernise an agreement that has had little change over the past 7 years. The agreement delivers \$7.4M worth of community services and employs many locals.

Significant capital works are scheduled in the 2022/23 Operational Plan as follows:

- Delivery of Council's Jetpatcher for road improvement
- \$1.85M on road infrastructure
- Extraction of rock from the Cascade Quarry 11,000 T
- \$5.3M of Electricity system improvements (smart meters, new Tesla Battery, business system upgrades)
- \$3.2M on new Waste Management Centre infrastructure (glass crusher, plastic management, cardboard management)
- \$1.8M wastewater design to lead to a tender process to construct
- \$800K road assessment study and development of a rehabilitation plan
- \$800K towards Sea Freight port management Cascade Port

I commend the 2022/23 Draft Operational Plan for your consideration.

REVENUE POLICY 2022 – 2023

Statutory Requirements

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 (NSW)(NI) the following statutory requirements are included in this document:

- Statement of ordinary and special rates
- Rating structure
- Statement of fees to be charged and pricing policy of goods and services
- Statement of borrowings
- Statement of private works, and
- Statement of business and commercial activities

Statement of Ordinary and Special Rates

Ordinary Rates

In 2022-2023 Council will levy ordinary rates using a structure comprising a base amount to which an ad valorem (rate in the dollar) component is added. The base amount has been maximised in each category to narrow the distribution of properties.

All rateable properties within each category, regardless of their land value, are levied a base amount. The balance of income for ordinary rates is derived by multiplying the land value of a property by a rate in the dollar for the relevant category. The amount payable by ratepayers under this component is dependent on the land value of the property as determined by the Valuer General (NI).

The total amount to be levied for ordinary rates (the yield) is \$1.625 million, as set by Council; there are no special rates levied.

The applied *Local Government Act 1993* (NSW)(NI) includes rating provisions for Norfolk Island and stipulates three rating categories applicable to Norfolk Island: Residential, Business and Farmland. Where a portion of land cannot be categorised into one of the three categories listed above, the default category is Business.

Definition of the categories from the Local Government Act 1993 (NSW)(NI) are as follows:

Residential

- (1) Land is to be categorised as "residential" if it is a parcel of rateable land valued as one assessment and:
 - (a) its dominant use is for residential accommodation (other than as a hotel, motel, guest-house, backpacker hostel or nursing home or any other form of residential accommodation (not being a boarding house or a lodging house) prescribed by the regulations), or
 - (b) in the case of vacant land, it is zoned or otherwise designated for use under an environmental planning instrument (with or without development consent) for residential purposes, or
 - (c) it is rural residential land

Commencing in the 22/23 financial year, Council is introducing sub-categories as follows.

 - (a) has a significant and substantial commercial purpose or character, and
 - (b) is engaged in for the purpose of profit on a continuous or repetitive basis (whether or not a profit is actually made).
 - (c) Land is not to be categorised as farmland if it is rural residential land.
 - (d) The regulations may prescribe circumstances in which land is or is not to be categorised as farmland.

Commencing in the 22/23 financial year, Council is introducing sub-categories as follows.

Rating Structure

The Norfolk Island Applied Laws Ordinance 2016, Item 35 - sets out the minimum amounts of ordinary rates the Regional Council must levy. It provides that in year one (year ended 30 June 2017) the Regional Council must levy at least \$500,000. In subsequent years the Regional Council must levy at least \$1 million.

The Norfolk Island Regional Council has adopted a value-based rating system in compliance with the *Local Government Act 1993* (NSW)(NI). Ordinary rates are levied under section 494 of the Local Government Act and, special rates under section 495.

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Rates and Charges Hardship Assistance Policy

Council updated the Hardship Policy to assist ratepayers on 20 February 2019 (resolution 2019/20).

Exemptions

Current exemptions are only applicable under the *Local Government Act 1993 (NSW)(NI)* and the associated regulations, this includes Crown Land, the Hospital and the School. There are currently 170 properties which are exempt from land rates.

Interest

Interest on overdue amounts is set by NSW Office of Local Government, this amount is also adopted by the Norfolk Island Regional Council. Interest on overdue amounts for 2022-2023 is 6.0%.

Arrears

The total balance of arrears at 30 April 2022 is \$247,619.58.

Statement of Fees to be Charged and the Pricing Policy of Goods and Services

Council fees for the 2022-2023 financial year are listed in the schedule of Fees and Charges.

In determining the appropriate fees to be charged for Council services and facilities in 2022-2023, the principle applied is that charges should be considered fair and equitable to the general community. The range of services provided by Council to the community is incredibly diverse and requires different considerations when determining an associated fee or charge.

The total fee or charge is determined having regard to the following categories:

Code	Description
A	Economic Cost Total cost of providing services for private good.
В	Community Service Services considered to have a level of benefit to the community. Generally, benefits are not solely confined to users. These services are partially funded by rates.
С	Regulated Charges Charges which are determined by legislation.
D	User Pays Principal Services under this category are such that individual costs can be determined and met by the user of the service.
E	Market Forces Services that Council operates in a competitive market. Charges are similar to other providers.
F	Cost Plus Services provided on a commercial basis with an amount of profit included.

Fees which appear in the scheduled of Fees and Charges identify the applicable pricing category.

Statement of Borrowings

Council has no current plans to borrow additional funds in 2022-2023. Where grants are available which may allow construction of an asset sooner, then loans are used to attract or match that grant.

To provide for the future needs of our community, Council may borrow funds to provide infrastructure and community assets which are not able to be funded out of normal revenue sources. Loans allow Council to spread the cost of the asset over the length of the loan period, ensuring that both current and future generations contribute to paying for the asset. This is in accordance with the inter-generational equity principle. Council avoids borrowing for the annual recurring cost of asset renewals.

Acquired loans are based on periods which represent the economic life of the facility and/or asset, or a reasonable fixed term, whichever is the lesser. All loans are financed from an approved financial institution that offers the most competitive interest rate.

For information on Council's debt cover ratio refer to the Annual Financial Statements available on Council's website.

Statement of Private Works

The *Local Government Act 1993* (NSW)(NI) enables Council to carry out the following works for residents and organisations on private land:

- · Paving and road making
- Kerbing and guttering
- Demolition and excavation
- Water, sewerage and drainage connections
- Land clearing and tree felling
- · Tree planting and maintenance
- Fencing and ditching
- Miscellaneous works and services

Plant is to be charged at the prescribed rate adopted by council in the schedule of Fees and Charges. The following conditions apply:

- A charge for the appropriate operator is to be added to all vehicle and small plant hire rates
- Overtime rates may apply and hire rates should be adjusted accordingly
- Travelling time will be charged at full rate for plant
- Additional charges will apply if truck transport is required
- Minimum charge is one hour

Materials and labour are to be charged at cost plus an agreed overhead rate, ensuring freight and waste charges are included in the total price. Large contracts and Government works will be individually determined by quote as per financial delegations.

Statement of Business Government Activities

Council conducts the following commercial activities:

- Waste Management
- Airport
- Water Assurance (Sewer)
- Telecom
- Electricity
- Liquor Bond

Waste Management

Charges which apply to domestic and commercial waste management are determined in accordance with the recovery of costs to manage waste management on Norfolk Island.

Community Waste Services Charge

The Community Waste Services Charge of \$1.0M will be applied in accordance with the new subcategories within the rating system.

Airport

Fees and charges at this time are set in the schedule of Fees and Charges for 2022-2023.

Water Assurance (Sewer)

Water assurance charges are set in accordance with the adopted schedule of Fees and Charges. Charges apply to all properties that are connected to the Island's sewer system (water assurance scheme). The charges relate to the type of use of the property and in some cases the intended use and/or occupancy.

Telecom

Council approved (19 August 2020 Resolution 2020/131) all Norfolk Telecom Fees and Charges (Pricing Policy Categories E & F) be changed to Commercial Retail Price so that Norfolk Telecom can be better placed to respond to evolving customer service expectations and demands. Norfolk Telecom will maintain a full list of Fees and Charges on the NT website.

Electricity

Charges that apply to Electricity are based on user pay to cover the cost of electricity generation and distribution on the Island. It is based on sharing the cost of the infrastructure and use of the poles and wires as well as the electricity itself.

Liquor Bond

The Liquor Bond prices both its wholesale and retail items at commercial rates. Pricing Policy E – Market Forces applies, however, there is currently limited competition in the market for these products.
